POSITION DESCRIPTION

The OSU College of Education seeks an experienced and scholarly faculty member at the tenure-track Assistant or Associate Professor rank. The appointee will be responsible for research, teaching, and service within the Department of Adult Education and Higher Education Leadership with specific emphasis in the Community College Leadership Program. The Community College Leadership Program prepares individuals for administrative leadership roles in community and technical college settings. We are especially seeking applicants with experience with one or more of the following areas of scholarship: curriculum development, workforce education, history and philosophy of higher education, educational policy, leadership and administration, multiculturalism and diversity, organizational development, legal issues and finance.

POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Conduct active and productive research related to community college leadership, higher education administration and related areas.
2. Teach graduate classes primarily within the Community College Leadership Program and, as appropriate, classes related to adult education, organization and human resource education.
3. Advise graduate students, serve on and chair master's and doctoral student committees.
4. Collaborate with others to promote and support the College's mission, vision and values.
5. Participate in professional activities in support of the scholarly development of faculty, staff and students.
6. Develop a strong working relationship with other units on and off campus, including professional associations, statewide boards/agencies as well as local and regional community and technical colleges.
7. Participate in the governance of the College.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

1. An earned doctorate in educational leadership or a closely related field (e.g., higher education, adult education, organization and human resource development).
2. Relevant teaching and advising experience at the college/university level.
3. Evidence of the potential for or a record of research and scholarly publication.
4. Demonstrated professional work experience in institutions of higher education.
5. A demonstrable commitment to promoting and enhancing diversity.
6. Experience chairing or evidence of the potential to chair doctoral committees and advising quantitative and qualitative doctoral and master's level research.

Candidates must also possess exceptional communication, interpersonal, and leadership skills and be able to work collaboratively with the faculty and leadership team of the College of Education.

For the Associate Professor level, in addition to the above qualifications, applicants must possess a significant record of outstanding scholarship.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

1. Research or experience related to at least one of the following programs: Community College Leadership; Adult Education, Human Resource Education.
2. Experience securing external funding for research.
3. Previous professional work experience in or with technical/community colleges.
4. Demonstrated significant involvement with relevant professional organizations.
5. Experience working within a cohort program model.
6. Experience related to one of the STEM areas (science, technology, engineering, or mathematics)
